Our Community

Pennsbury School District is comprised of four municipalities located in the southeastern corner of idyllic Bucks County, Pennsylvania: Yardley Borough, Lower Makefield Township, Falls Township, and Tullytown Borough. The District covers 49 square miles. The economically-diverse community residents range from industrial workers to professionals who commute daily to New York City and Philadelphia. With an enrollment of more than 10,300 students, Pennsbury School District currently has ten elementary schools (K-5), three middle schools (6-8), and one high school with two campus buildings. In addition, Village Park Academy offers programs to address the unique needs of students in grades 4 to 12.



National School District of Character

In 2015, Pennsbury was named a National School District of Character by Character.org, a national advocate and leader for the character education movement. The following was considered in the evaluation for National District of Character recognition: an accomplished record of academic excellence; a tradition of service learning, leadership, and community involvement; and strong partnerships among local businesses, nonprofits, government agencies, and the schools.
