Comprehensive Planning Process

- Develop Action Plans specific to each goal area.
- Present publicly to the Board of School Directors.
- Place on display for final community review and feedback.
- Vote as a Board of School Directors to approve the Comprehensive Plan (November 2019).
- Submit electronically to the Pennsylvania Department of Education by November 30, 2019.

Develop Facilities Plan

- Hold meeting for entire Board of School Directors to review the Building Utilization Study and Facility Progress Report from Bonnett Associates, Inc.
- Recommend scope and sequence of proposed construction and renovation work.
- Review associated multi-year financial projections related to proposed construction and renovation work.
- Select and approve professional services providers for proposed construction and renovation work.

Transition to Electronic Platform for Board Business

- Select vendor to host repository of agendas and supporting documents for committee meetings, action meetings, and post-production work.
- Train appropriate staff to develop understanding and skills to support management and functionality of the system.
- Share access, when appropriate, with the community at-large to enhance transparency of Board activity.
- Coordinate with Pennsylvania School Boards Association to purchase policy development services connected to the electronic platform.
- Develop schedule of Board policy revisions to guide the work of the Board Policy Committee as well as the decisions of the full Board of School Directors when considering approval of any policy.

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Enhance Security Measures District-wide

- Conduct training for various stakeholders in the ALICE system of response.
- Purchase Ruvna Accountability Tool to support emergency response and reunification processes.
- Complete training for Workplace Safety Committee.
- Analyze current network security and recommend any necessary enhancements to the Board of School Directors by June 2020.

Support Consideration of New Educational Initiatives

- Implement K-12 STEM Program
 - Implement SPARK program as 5th elementary school special area period.
 - Assess the benefits/challenges of offering such learning opportunities.
- Develop and implement the Cyber Academy at Pennsbury (CAP)
 - Determine and procure the most appropriate curricular options for students.
 - Advertise availability of the cyber learning opportunity through print and electronic media.
 - Host a community evening event to attract potential students and families.
 - Monitor student participation at CAP throughout the year.
- Investigate changing school start times.
 - Review literature and research from prominent medical and educational experts.
 - Form an ad-hoc committee of stakeholders to meet throughout the year discussing research, community survey results and possible scheduling alternatives.
 - Present a progress report to the Board of School Directors and community by June 2020.
- Engage in curriculum renewal processes to enhance educators' ability to meet the needs of all students.
 - Host curriculum writing opportunities for District-wide curriculum leaders with support from expert, Dr. Jay McTighe.
 - Enhance K-12 assessment plan.
