- Questions in the Critical Reading Section ask students to understand texts but won't ask them to cite evidence in their answers. Writing Section questions are based on sentences or short paragraphs.

**MATH** 

**EVIDENCE-BASED READING AND WRITING** 

- Measures skills and knowledge students need to be ready for college and beyond. Better reflects what students learn in class.
- Focuses on math that research shows is used most in college and career.
- Questions in the Evidence-Based Reading and Writing Section are passage-based. Students are asked to support answers with evidence from a passage.
