They say that Kaitlin always demonstrates kindness by including others. She has the confidence to treat all of her fellow classmates with kindness, no matter what their differences may be. Kaitlin is often observed cleaning up without being asked, helping her teammates or those that need extra assistance, and lending a hand to the teacher by organizing supplies and distributing or collecting student work. Kaitlin is a member of Afton's Green Team. She helps collect items to recycle and reuse, has participated in an on-campus bulb-planting project, starred in a PECO Natural Gas Safety PSA with her teammates, and is looking forward to many more community outreach projects this year.
