Pennsbury Students Recognized for Citizenship

(Fallsington, PA) – Congratulations to the Pennsbury-LYFT Character Award winners for June. Maximus Mormando, Jean Haba, Nicholas Christopher, Anthony Klyuchnyk, Luke Sherratt*, and Nolan Kolanko* were honored at the Pennsbury School Board of Directors meeting on Thursday, June 16, 2022.

The purpose of the Pennsbury-LYFT Character Award is to recognize and reward students who embody exemplary character traits and behaviors. The character trait for June was *citizenship*.

Maximus Mormando is a kindergartener at Fallsington Elementary School. He was nominated by Cherie Lynne Kooker, Vinny DePaola, Terri Sherman, Michelle Kinney, Debbie Hellmuth and Kristen Cahill. They said in their nomination that Max is a shining example of good citizenship. He displays respect for all around him and helps keep his area of the classroom neat and clean. He loves to volunteer and lead others, but also is happy to support his peers. His actions help to create a fun and supportive kindergarten community.

Jean Haba is a fifth-grader at Penn Valley Elementary School and was nominated by Arlene Johnson, Barbara Hidalgo, Jennifer Gatt, and Marty O'Donnell. They shared that Jean takes his role as a school safety seriously and ensures that the youngest of Penn Valley students arrive to their classes on time. He recently helped out during Penn Valley's Armed Forces Celebration Day and learned how to properly fold a flag and present it to a veteran. He was one of only four

children selected to present at the April school board meeting and proudly represented his school.

Nicholas Christopher, an eighth-grader at Pennwood Middle School, was nominated by Debbie Lomas. She said that Nicky loves to volunteer to support his community. As a "Birthday Bandit," he decorates lawns with fun-filled birthday surprises and raises funds to support his favorite cause, the Alpha Bravo Canine organization. This is a nonprofit that raises, trains, and donates service dogs for U.S. military veterans. In the classroom, he is respectful to others. He is a team player and always willing to help.

Anthony Klyuchnyk is in tenth grade at Pennsbury High School. Anthony was nominated by Cheryl Ann Schmids. Anthony has demonstrated his support for the Pennsbury School District community by assisting and interpreting for four new students who have recently relocated to the US from Ukraine. He escorted the students to class and assisted at the East Library to help the tech department get students translation devices. His demeanor, leadership skills, and supportiveness are impressive.
