What Does SWPBS Look Like at Manor Elementary?

- 1. Expectations are displayed throughout the school.
- 2. Students, staff, and parents are taught the expectations throughout the school year.
- 3. Students and staff are able to state the expectations.
- 4. Staff members model Positive Behavior Support expectations for students.
- 5. Students are reinforced for displaying appropriate behavior in school.

How Can Parents Help with Positive Behavior Support?

- Talk to your child about their school day.
- Ask your child about "Manor Strong" tickets they have received.
- Keep communication between you and your child's teacher active throughout the school year.
- Focus on the positive choices your child is making.

Reinforcements

When a student is caught displaying appropriate expectations, they are praised and reinforced with a "Manor Strong" ticket. They are then part of the Manor Strong 200 club and will bring home a certificate and their name will be logged in the Manor Strong log that is kept in the office for visitors to see. They will also pick a number to place their ticket in the club chart. Once there are ten numbers filled in a row those students will receive a special recognition.

Consequences are still given for inappropriate behavior. These consequences may Include:

- Discipline Referral Form Completed
- Conference with the student
- Warning issued
- Parent contacted
- Time in office
- Lunch in office
- Student/Teacher Conference
- Loss of privilege
- Detention and or suspension in accordance with district student conduct policy

- Keep hands and feet to yourself
- Keep the aisle clear
- Listen to adults thee first time
- Leave the building quietly
- Go directly to your assigned area

Playground Expectations

- Voice Level 4
- Listen to adults the first time
- Include everyone in games and activities
- Enter building quietly
- Practice good sportsmanship
- Dress for the weather
- Return equipment
- Use equipment properly
- Report unsafe behavior
- Walk away from fights and arguments and tell an adult
- Stay in assigned area
- Keep hands and feet to yourself.

Cafeteria Expectations

- Voice level 2
- Use Manners
- Use food and beverages in an expected way
- Clean up after yourself and others
- Raise hand for assistance
- Use your own money
- Stay seated with feet under the table
- Sit 3 at a bench
- Eat your own food
